

**Dr. Arturo Ortega** is recognized as one of the most dynamic conducting talents of his generation, performing regularly on prestigious stages across four continents. He debuted at 19 with the Laredo Philharmonic Orchestra and continued his training with the San Antonio Symphony Orchestra, where he was mentored by international conductors. He studied under Anshel Brusilow at the University of North Texas, earning master's and doctoral degrees in orchestral conducting, and attended the

prestigious Pierre Monteaux School for Conductors on a full scholarship. Before completing his studies, he was a semi-finalist for the Assistant Conductor position with the internationally renowned Chicago Symphony Orchestra.

Currently, he serves as Music Director of the Robson Ranch and Voices of Flower Mound choirs, as well as the Trietsch Memorial United Methodist Church Orchestra. A sought-after adjudicator and mentor, he frequently conducts all-region and all-state orchestras and choirs across the U.S. Further abroad, he regularly guest-conducts some of the most acclaimed orchestras and choruses around the globe. He has also held leadership roles on the boards of many civic organizations, including the YMCA and the Bach Society, and currently serves on the Executive Board of AIM Music & Arts in Colorado and Idaho.



**Paul Lees** is a versatile pianist, keyboardist, composer, arranger, and educator in the Dallas/Fort Worth area. He holds a Master of Music in Jazz Studies degree from the University of North Texas where he was a member of the seven-time Grammy-nominated One O'Clock Lab Band. He has recorded eight studio albums with various bands and artists, the most recent of which is "This Light Has No Darkness, Vol. 1" with legendary jazz bassist David Friesen, which received a 4-star review

in DownBeat and was included in the editor's picks.

Paul has performed with Doc Severinsen, Christian McBride, Jimmy Heath, Wycliffe Gordon, Marshall Gilkes, and Sean Jones and has recorded with David Friesen, Tom Harrell, Jon Faddis, James Morrison, Bob McChesney, Allen Vizzutti, and Louis Dowdeswell. He has also had the opportunity to perform concerts in Berlin, Vienna, Prague, Rio, and Ukraine. In February 2023, Paul had the privilege of playing on a concert at Carnegie Hall directed by Mack Wilberg. Currently, Paul is the pianist for Denton Bible Church and is the accompanist for the Voices of Flower Mound and the Robson Ranch Community Choir.
